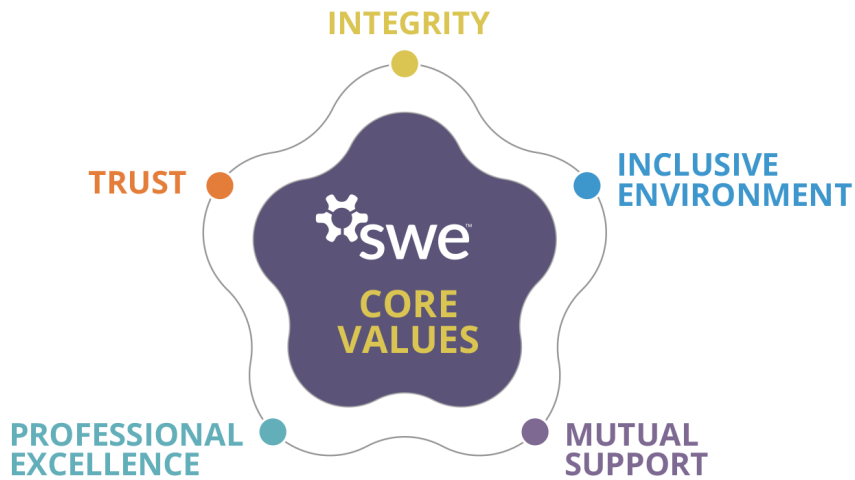

Professional Development and Mentoring

WE17: The World's Largest Conference for Women Engineers

- WE17 is SWE's national conference and the highlight of our Fall semester and our largest national event. The year's event will be held October 26 – 28, 2017 in Austin, where more than 6,000 women and men in engineering and technology will converge, giving students access to leaders in engineering education institutions and companies from across the nation. This event is a gateway to internships, co-ops, and career opportunities, as well as educational workshops and seminars. This year, our goal will be to bring 25 members to conference. With your assistance, your company will be able to provide our members with subsidized travel accommodations, hotel accommodations, and registration fees.



Workshops and Info Sessions

- Each company has an opportunity to hold an information session/workshop with our members throughout the school year. This creates an opportunity for students to interact with recruiters and learn about the many opportunities the company has to offer.

- A mentorship program for high school juniors and seniors that focuses on college prep and leadership skills.

Introduce a Girl to Engineering

- An E-week event that introduces young girls to engineering through activities they can relate to their everyday lives. Previous activities have been simple wiring for making a lamp and chemical process for making slime. This event serves the 5th graders of Aycock Middle School.

Girl Scouts Day – All Girls Can Engineer

- An all-day event that introduces young girl scouts to engineering through activities they can relate to their everyday lives. Previous activities have been building a tent for survival, egg drop test, and create your own lava lamp. This event serves a local Greensboro troop.
