WE19: The World's Largest Conference for Women Engineers

• WE19 is SWE's national conference and the highlight of our Fall semester and our largest national event. This year's event will be held November 7th - 9th, 2019 in Anaheim, California. Over 6,000 men and women in engineering and technology will converge, giving students access to leaders in engineering educational institutions and companies from across the nation. This event is a gateway to internships, co-ops, and career opportunities, as well as educational workshops and seminars. This year, our goal will be to allow 15 members outside of the Executive Board to attend the conference. Your assistance will provide much needed travel and hotel accommodations, and registration fees.

SWE Local: Regional Conference, (Raleigh, North Carolina)

• WE Local is a Society of Women Engineers (SWE) program that was developed to bring the excitement and energy of SWE's annual conference - on a smaller scale - to our members' backyards around the globe through local conferences. WE Local brings together participants in all stages of their collegiate and professional journeys. The 2020 conference will be held in Raleigh, North Carolina from February 21st - 22nd.

Introduce a Girl to Engineering

• An E-week event that introduces young girls to engineering through activities they can relate to their everyday lives. Previous activities have been simple wiring for making a lamp and chemical process for making slime. This event serves the 8th graders of Melvin C. Swann Middle School.

Girl Scouts Day – All Girls Can Engineer

• An all-day event that introduces young girl scouts to engineering through activities they can relate to their everyday lives. Previous activities have been building a tent for survival, egg drop test, and create your own lava lamp. This event serves a local Greensboro girl scout troop.



Upcoming Programs

General Body Meetings (GBM) are used to engage and inform members. This year The Society of Women Engineers has decided to focus on the next step after the undergraduate degree. From dressing properly to secure a job to becoming a professional in the workplace, SWE wants students to be aware of what the future holds.

"What I Wish I Would've Known" (September 17, 2019)

• A program to help students prepare for the upcoming school year by receiving advice from upperclassmen on various study habits, professional development tips, successfully maneuvering the career fair, and more.

Balling on a Budget (September 24, 2019)

• A kick-start program aimed at teaching students how to manage a budget and continually monitor spending throughout the semester. Attendees will be given "money" at the beginning of the program and will encounter various scenarios throughout the course of the program to help them make smart decisions about spending money.

No Face, No Case: SWE Edition (October 8, 2019)

• This program will be an open-ended discussion about the challenges that female and minority engineering students face during college and in the working world, while also providing advice on overcoming those challenges.

Professional Dining: 101 (November 5, 2019)

• A program that discusses and educates students on proper etiquette while attending a professional lunch/dinner outing. If you are interested in providing a professional etiquette experience please let us know.
